### Modern Slavery Policy Statement

Town & Country Fine Foods Ltd. is committed to upholding the provisions of the Modern Slavery Act 2015, fostering transparency within the organization and among suppliers of goods and services. Through rigorous due diligence, the company is confident that there is no evidence of modern-day slavery or human trafficking within its own operations.


As a privately owned business, our primary focus remains on providing wholesale services, repacking, and distributing low-risk ambient food products to various sectors, including UK hotels, restaurants, cruise lines, stadia, and other wholesale customers.

Our supplier base is predominantly sourced as follows: 50% from the UK, 40% from EU countries, and 10% from World Markets (Switzerland & the Philippines).

Recognizing that imported goods from sources beyond the UK and EU may pose a higher risk of slavery and human trafficking issues, we continually monitor the level of management control required for these sources. To fortify our due diligence, our supplier approval process includes a comprehensive review of the controls implemented by the supplier.

Our commitment extends to actively supporting international initiatives that promote ethical principles and practices in preventing the exploitation and abuse associated with modern slavery and human trafficking. We expect a similar commitment to these principles from all organizations we engage with, and we will not knowingly support or deal with any business involved in slavery or human trafficking.

The Company Directors and Senior Management bear the responsibility for implementing this policy statement and its objectives. They will allocate adequate resources, including training and investment, to ensure that slavery and human trafficking are not taking place within the organization or its supply chains.
